



Wolf Uniform

2nd Grade

Required:

- Blue Scout Shirt (Long or Short Sleeve – may be layered over long sleeve undershirt)
- Yellow or Red Wolf Neckerchief
- Red Wolf Slide (Boy-made handicraft slides may also be worn)
- Wolf Handbook

The shirt will last through fourth Grade – leave them room to grow!

Optional:

- Yellow or Red Wolf Hat (or a Cub Scouts hat without rank – consider labeling with name so you know which is your Scout's!) – please note Scouts are discouraged from wearing non-Scouting hats while in uniform
- Cub Scout Belt (recommended) - belt needed to display Belt Loop awards
- Scout Pants or Shorts – but blue pants or jeans are just fine, too!

Each Year Your Scout will need:

- New Handbook for next level
- A Neckerchief for the next level
- New Hat for next level (optional)
- New Slide for next level (optional)

The Uniform Code:

Your Scout should and will be encouraged to wear their uniform appropriately. The shirt should be tucked in and orderly. The importance of positively representing Pack 85 and the entire Boy Scout Organization while in uniform should be emphasized and understood.

Time to Sew?

The images on this page will help with the placement of emblems and patches. If you can't sew, you can also use Badge Magic, which is available at our Council's Scout Shop.

Note: if you choose to use an adhesive, thermal patch or Badge Magic to attached your patches to your uniform, make sure you first remove the sticker on the back of the patch. Otherwise, the patch will later separate from the sticker leaving a spot showing adhesive and a sticker without a patch.

Patches You'll need to Buy

- **World Scouting Crest** (above left pocket)
The World Scouting Crest is Worn by all members of Scouting as a symbol of international cooperation in the Scouting movement. Features fleur-de-lis, two stars (for "truth" and "knowledge"), rope ("unity"), and square knot ("service"). It is worn above the left pocket, centered left-to-right and centered top-to-bottom from shoulder seam to pocket.
- **Cradle of Liberty Council Patch** (left upper sleeve, may come with some shirts)
- **Pack Numbers: "8" & "5"** (centered below Council Patch)
- **Flag** (upper right sleeve and comes with the shirt)
- **Den Number Patch** – check with Cub Master or Den Leader for your Den Number! (placed under flag on right sleeve) – Your Scout's Den Number will not change while in our Pack.

Optional Patches you may choose to Buy

- **1910 World Scout Crest Ring** (optional and around World Scout Crest)
Designed to encircle the World Scout Crest, the embroidered 1910 World Scout Crest Ring celebrates the 100+ year history of Boy Scouts of America. It is not required for uniform wear, but makes a handsome addition.

Patches and Awards You Don't Buy

Any Rank Advancement Badge or Patch that your boy earns will be awarded (at no cost) during the Monthly Pack Meetings.

- **Outdoor Activity Emblem** (wearer's right pocket flap)
- **Bobcat Patch** (wearer's left pocket)
- **Wolf Patch** (below and to the left - as viewed - of the Bobcat Patch)
- **Belt Loops** (displayed on belt)

- **Temporary Patches** (earned for participation in special events or awarded at the District or Council level, i.e. Summer Camp patches or Shooting Sports Awards - only one may be worn at a time on the right pocket or hung from the right pocket button)

Wearing the Uniform

In general, every Cub Scout should wear their uniform to all Cub Scouting activities, including Den and Pack meetings, unit outings, and any activities done with members of the Den or Pack. When playing sports, going to Camp, or participating in other physical activities, a Pack may opt to have the Cub Scouts wear an alternate uniform, such as an activity shirt. These are sometimes referred to as Class B Uniforms. Our Pack's blue "Class B" uniform tee-shirts are provided when you complete your Registration with us!

Pack leaders should provide advance notice of any occasion when the Scouts should wear anything other than the complete uniform.

Any time you are uncertain about your Scout's uniform, ask the Den Leader, Cub Master, or Awards Chair for guidance.
